Approach and Goal

- Goal: installing bird houses at the Library provides education opportunities and shows relevance of the Library
- Collaborative effort between the Bastrop Public Library, City of Bastrop, and Lost pines Garden Club
 - Compliment other projects/initiatives (e.g., at Fisherman's' Park)
- Have publicity for these birdhouses and the purpose as part of protecting wildlife and the environment
- Assess results and next steps
- Lost Pines Garden Club (ideally with other groups) maintains the houses such as checking at least twice a year
- Birdhouses will weather and eventually need replacement for a limited cost and time

This project is not complex or expensive, benefits birds and people, sustainable, and could be replicated almost anywhere


Summary of Bird Houses for Bastrop Public Library and City of Bastrop: Can be Replicated Elsewhere



- A public service project for public spaces such as Bastrop Public Library and city parks
 - Support of protecting the environment and education
- Provide houses for birds native to or migrating through our portion of Central Texas
 - Support "our winged friends"
 - Help maintain a natural environment in rural or suburban areas
 - Provide supplemental shelter for wildlife (e.g., native birds) while discouraging predators
 - Houses are available for songbirds (Texas Bluebirds, etc.), ducks, or bats
- Install two Bird houses at Library
 - More could follow
 - Document, maintain, and possibly use cameras for education and to show progress
- Complement the project completed for "bird Houses at Fisherman's Park" by Rotary Club of Bastrop County
 - Later locations might be Bob Bryant Park, Mayfest Park, and/or Bastrop City Hall
- Do periodic checking and cleaning to maintain houses and assess results
- Optionally install "Bird box camera(s)" and allow remote viewing by Library patrons or from anywhere (e.g., EarthCam)

Bird Houses at Bastrop Public Library

- Both bird houses are Bluebird type
- Bird house #1 planned to have a nest camera



Example of Bird House with Predator Guard and sign

- Illustrates configuration with "Native bird house" (e.g., Bluebird)
- Duck house, Bluebird house would be similar
- This is mounted on a 6' T post
 - 8' on public parks for nest security
- Owl and bat houses mounted high on poles





Texas Bluebird Society Style Birdhouse

- www.texasbluebirdsociety.org/BuildingPlans.php
- Has swing out door for checking and periodic cleaning
- Made of pine glued up boards
- Paint exterior with light color paint
- Label using "exterior vinyl sticker"
 - Simple, inexpensive, and flexible on design
- Optionally could be modified to accommodate a "Bird nest camera"



Bird Houses for Fisherman's Park and Bastrop Library



Native songbird (e.g., Bluebird), Wood Duck, Bat houses, Owl

- Install on poles (e.g., T posts)
- Install guards for predators such as squirrels, racoons, snakes
- Check and clean every few months
- Some weathering is expected but plan to replace in approximately 4 years



Wood Duck house approximately 3 years old and still functional

8"x10" for predator guard

- Mount on "predator guard" on 8' T post
- 8"x10" outdoor vinyl sticker










Certified Wildlife Habitat for Parks, Libraires, Churches, etc.






Predator Guard

- Predator guard is based on "Stovepipe" design to deter predators (snakes, racoons, squirrels, etc.)
- Use 4" plastic pipe
 - Cut 10' pipe into five 2' guards
- Cap mounts on top of 4" pipe
 - Cut appropriate opening for T post using drill and oscillating saw
- Stainless steel hose claps on T posts prevents guard sliding down




A Promising Camera for "Bird Nest Camera"

Example of sharing process to allow remote viewing of cameras such to the administrator's approval




Example Images of Bird House and Bird Feeder Using Wireless IP Camera



Wasp Screen and Source of Light

- Adding insect screen to ventilation openings at top of box may deter wasps
- Adds some sunlight to inside bird house
 - Adds daylight for color pictures and videos on Bird nest camera
 - Birds need to deal with sunlight and other challenges anyway so some light from a window should not be an issue
- Process: cut rectangle of window screen to cover opening

Prototype of Bird Box Nest Camera

- Used FAODOO camera with WiFi and solar panel
- Camera would be inside on clear plastic floor and pointed down
- Bird box would be 3" taller to accommodate the camera






Bird Houses Installed at Bastrop Public Library

Modified House for Bird Nest Camera


- Increase height by 3" and width by 1" to accommodate camera inside house pointed down
 - Camera is 2.5" high
- Install insect screen on ventilation spaces
- Make ventilation space 1" to allow light






Bird Feeders (optional)

- Can attract and support birds
- Does require refilling (e.g., Sunflower seeds)
- Picture is from Jones house with two feeders and mounting pole made at a local high school
 - Attracts and supports a large quality of birds
 - Has pivot mechanism to simplify refill process
